A Little Discussion...of Literal Events...Literarily Covered in Gen 1 - 9

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

Now the earth existed waste and void, and darkness [was] over the face of the abyss, but the Spirit of God was roving over the face of the water. Then God said, "Let there be light," and there was light! And God saw the light, that [it was] good, so God distinguished between the light and the darkness. Then God named the light "day," and He named the darkness "night." Then there was evening, then there was morning, one day.

Then God said, "Let there be an expanse between the water, and let it distinguish water from water. So God made the expanse and distinguished between the water under the expanse and the water over the expanse, then it was so. Then God called the expanse "sky." Then there was evening, then there was morning, [a] second day.

Then God said, "Let the water under the sky be gathered to one place, and let dry [land] appear," then it was so. Then God named the dry [land] "[earth/land]," and the gathered water He named "seas." And God saw that [it was] good. Then God said, "Let the land [cause the sprouting of] vegetation: plant yielding like seed, tree fruit making fruit after its kind with seed in it upon the earth, then it was so. So the earth was [set to produce] vegetation, plant yielding like seed according to its kind, and tree making fruit (with) seed in it according to its kind, then God saw that [it was] good. Then there was evening, then there was morning, [a] third day.

Then God said, "Let there be lights in [the] expanse of the sky to distinguish between the day and the night, and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years, and let them be for lights in [the] expanse of the sky to shine upon the earth," then it was so. So God made the two great lights, the great[er] light for dominion of the day and the less[er] light for dominion of the night, and the stars. So God placed them in the expanse of the sky to shine upon the earth, and to have dominion in the day and in the night and to distinguish between the light and the darkness. And God saw that [it was] good. Then there was evening, then there was morning, [a] fourth day.

Then God said, "Let the water swarm with [a] swarm of living creature[s] and let flyers fly over the earth across the face of the expanse of the sky." So God created the great [sea] serpents and every living, creeping creature that swarms the water according to their kinds; and every winged flyer according to its kind. And God saw that [it was] good. Then God enriched them, saying, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the water in the seas, and let the flyer multiply on the earth." Then there was evening, then there was morning, [a] fifth day.

So God created humanity in His image; in [the] image of God He created them, male and female He created them.

Then God enriched them. Then God said, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it and rule over fish of the sea, and over flyer of the sky, and over every creature creeping upon the earth." Then God said, "Behold, I give to you every plant producing seed that's upon the face of all the earth, and every tree in which [the] fruit of [the] tree produces seed: let it be for food for you. And to every creature of the earth and to every flyer of the sky, and to every creeper upon the earth in which [is the] breath of life: every green plant for food," then it was so. And God saw all that He'd made, and behold: [it was] very good! Then there was evening, then there was morning, [a] sixth day.

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Then the heavens and the earth were completed, and all [the] host of them. So God completed by the seventh day His work that He had done. - The argument by Hans Küng (1928-2021)
 - There's a lot of uncertainty about the universe but...
 - Denying the existence of God renders the concept of reality totally untrustworthy.
 - Nihilism would be the only safe option, which people can't maintain in practice.

- Küng's Two choices
 - #1: Is there any room for trust in reality or not?

A) "either the universe is a 'home' for humanity full of meaning and value"


B) "it is a sheer happenstance devoid of any transcendent purpose"

- Küng's Two choices
 - #2: If you chose 'fundamental trust,' then uncertain reality either...

A) "has a ground and source that overcomes . . . absolute uncertainty" (it is ruled by divine providence)

OR

B) "it does not" (it is ruled by chance)



- Küng's Conclusion
 - Atheism is an option, but
 - "The choice to believe that reality is ruled by . . . God is rationally justified because it provides ground and support to fundamental trust, whereas atheism does not."
- **Note for today:** Atheism, or anything that's built on atheism, rejects the supernatural, and remodels the natural, by ignoring our **own nature**.

"[Theseus] slew Damastes, whom some call [Procrustes]. Pseudo-Apollodorus, *Epitome* 1.4, 1st - 2nd cent. AD



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
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

Important Exegetical Things for Genesis 1

- Not written to us first, or to us alone
 - Written for their understanding before ours (i.e., yom/"day")
- Informs a Late Bronze Age cosmology
 - Earthbound viewshed (no NASA pictures)
- Anti-Chaotic/Anti-Competitive
 - Originally anti-pagan
 - Not great for universal natural selection (remember: philosophy!)
- Not Poetry, Not Scientific


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

Then God said, "Let there be a vault between the water, and let it distinguish water from water. So God made the vault and distinguished between the water under the vault and the water over the vault, then it was so.







- Planetary Aquatic Submersion


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



 - Statistical modeling for population growth








"Carnian Pluvial Episode" Model

Evident terrestrial wetness equal to 1–2 million years of heavy rain (uniformitarianism)
Triggers significant changes to the surface of the planet and life upon it

Artifacts of the Primeval World of Genesis 1-9?

- No site on the surface of the earth could reasonably have survived the Flood intact
 - Some skeletal remains could be intact because decomposition would have finished after the flood receded; older skeletons should not be intact
 - The survival of anything we made beforehand in terms of craftsmanship, architecture, urbanism, or agriculture would be improbable

"The Silurian Hypothesis"

- Thought experiment: Could we detect an industrial civilization (like our own) if one arose in the distant past?
- From the Study: We would be dependent on observable material remains (archaeology), as well as the carbon, radioactive, & thermal footprint of the civilization
- From the Study: The lower the impact on the environment (means of work, production methods, agricultural strategies), the smaller the detectable footprint
 - My biblical archaeological inference:
 - It's unreasonable to expect to find a sedimentary surface from the time between Adam and Noah; it would be too partial, and buried deep below later geological layers
 - Primeval life wasn't advanced enough for a lasting footprint
