THE SECRET TO HAPPINESS!



Happiness 101

- **3.7-8** – Don't be wise in your own eyes; fear YHWH and turn away from evil. It will be healing to your [body], and drink to your bones.
- **12.20** – Deceit is in the heart of those who devise evil, but those who plan peace have joy. (ESV)
- **14.21** – Whoever despises his neighbor is a sinner, but blessed is he who is generous to the poor.



Happiness 101

- **16.20** – Whoever gives thought to a matter will discover good, and blessed is he who trusts in YHWH.
- **20.7** – The righteous who walks in his integrity—blessed are his children after him! (ESV)
- **23.15-16** – My child, if your heart is wise, then my heart also will be glad; my soul will rejoice when your lips speak what is right.



Regaining Happiness

- **12.18** – Speaking rashly is like sword thrusts; but the tongue of the wise, healing.
- **15.4** – A healing tongue is a tree of life, but perversion in it breaks the spirit.
- **15.23** – [A person] has joy in the answer of his mouth, and word [at the right time]—how good it is!



Regaining Happiness

- **15.30** – A bright look brings joy to the heart, and good news makes fat the bones.
- **16.24** – Pleasant words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones.
- **27.9** – Ointment and incense brings joy to the heart; the sweetness of one's friend [comes] from his sincere counsel.

Missing Happiness 101

- **13.9** – The light of the righteous shines brightly, but the lamp of the wicked goes out.
- **18.1** – He who has separated himself seeks desire, he breaks out [against] all sound judgment.
- **21.25-26** – The desire of the sluggard will kill him, for his hands refuse to work. All day long he craves and craves, but the righteous gives and does not hold back.



Missing Happiness 101

- **24.16-17** – Although a righteous person may fall seven times, he gets up again, but the wicked will be brought down by calamity. Don't rejoice when your enemy falls, and when he stumbles don't let your heart rejoice,

The Preclusion of Happiness

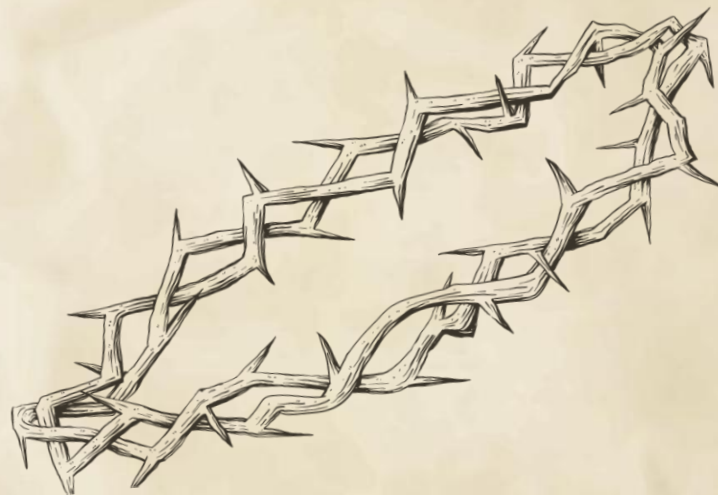
- **10.5** – He who gathers in summer is a prudent son, but he who sleeps in harvest is a son who brings shame. (ESV)
- **11.2** – When presumptuousness comes, then comes disgrace; but with humility comes wisdom.
- **13.18** – To the one who avoids discipline, poverty and shame, but the one who accepts reproof is honored.



The Preclusion of Happiness

- **19.26** – The one who robs his father and chases away his mother is a son who brings shame and disgrace.
- **25.7b-8** – What your eyes have seen, don't [take] hastily to litigation, for what will you do in the end, when your neighbor puts you to shame?
