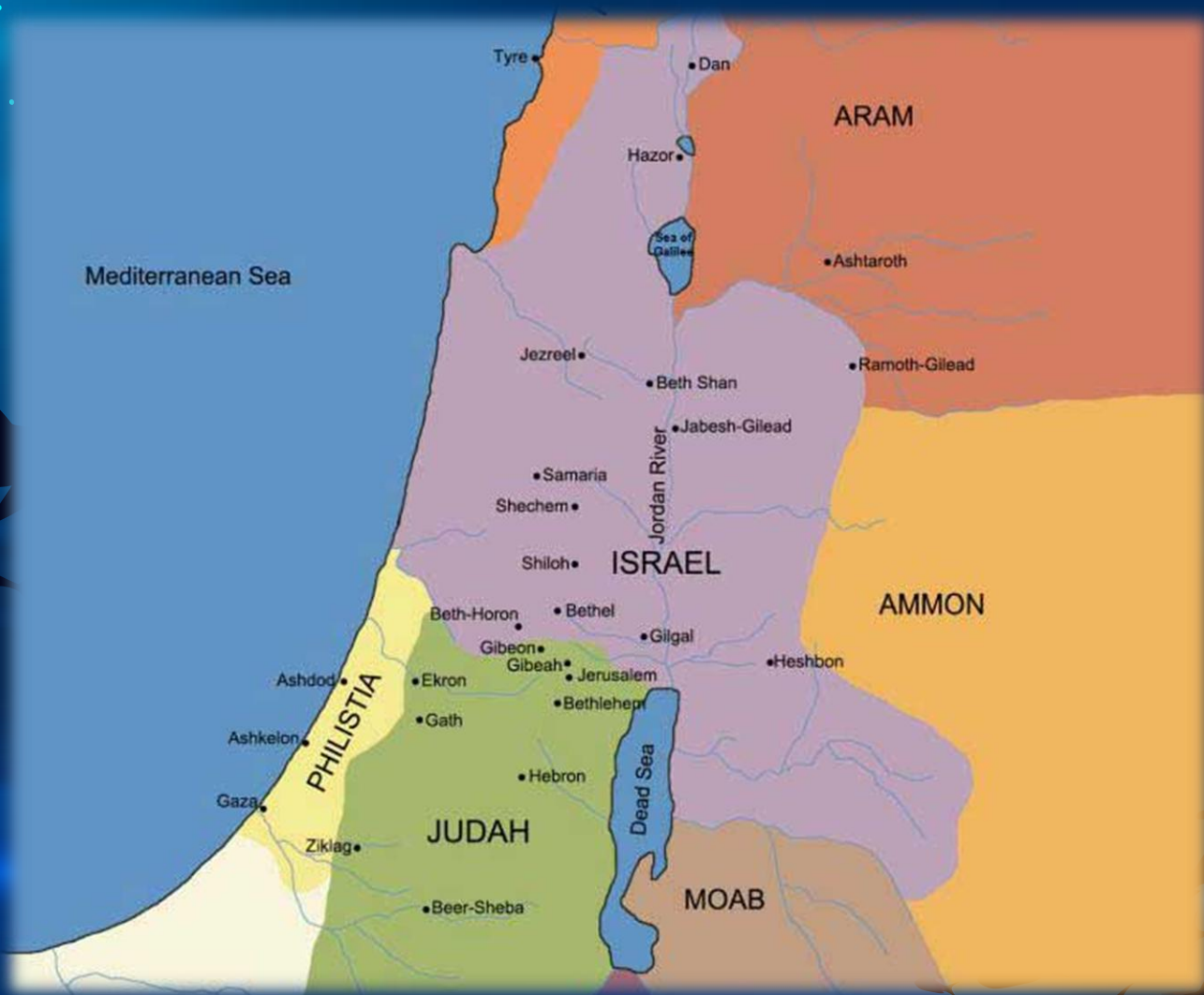

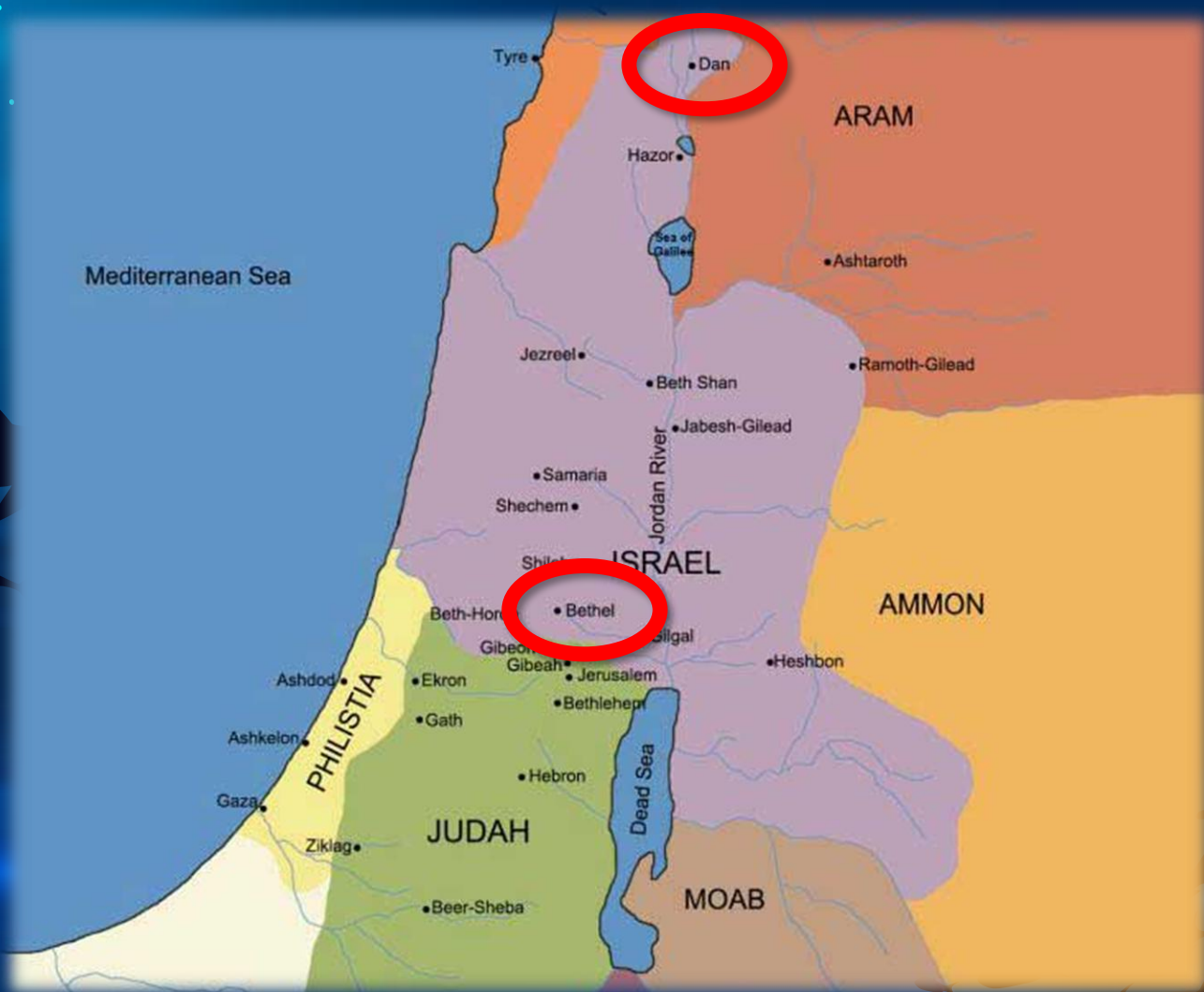

1 Kings 12.26-33

Jeroboam said in his heart, "Now the kingdom will return to the house of David. If this people go up to offer sacrifices in the house of YHWH at Jerusalem, then the heart of this people will return to their lord, to Rehoboam king of Judah; and they will kill me and return to Rehoboam king of Judah." So the king consulted, and made two golden calves, and he said to them, "It is too much for you to go up to Jerusalem; behold your gods, O Israel, that brought you up from the land of Egypt." He set one in Bethel, and the other he put in Dan. Now this thing became a sin, for the people went before the one as far as Dan. And he made houses on high places, and made priests from among all the people who were not of the sons of Levi. Jeroboam instituted a feast in the eighth month on the fifteenth day of the month, like the feast which is in Judah, and he went up to the altar; thus he did in Bethel, sacrificing to the calves which he had made. 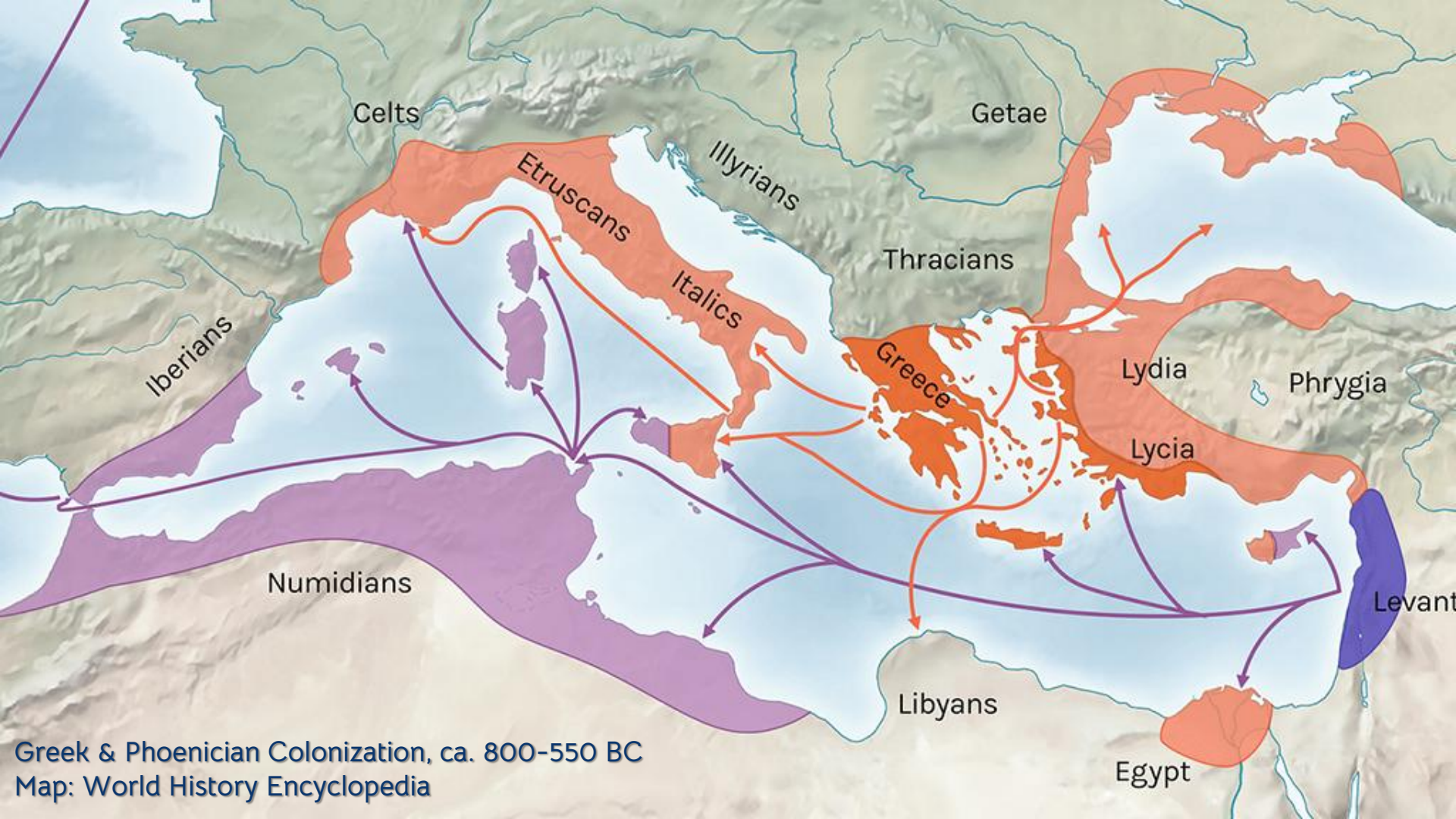



Then the sea will become calm for you, for I know that on account of me this great storm is upon you.” However, the men rowed *desperately* back toward land, but they were unable because the sea was [growing worse and worse].

Then they cried out to YHWH and said, “We earnestly pray, O YHWH, do not let us perish on account of this man’s life and do not count innocent blood against us; for You, O YHWH, have done as You’ve pleased.”

So they picked up Jonah, threw him into the sea, and the sea stopped its raging. Then the men feared YHWH greatly, and they offered sacrifices and made vows.

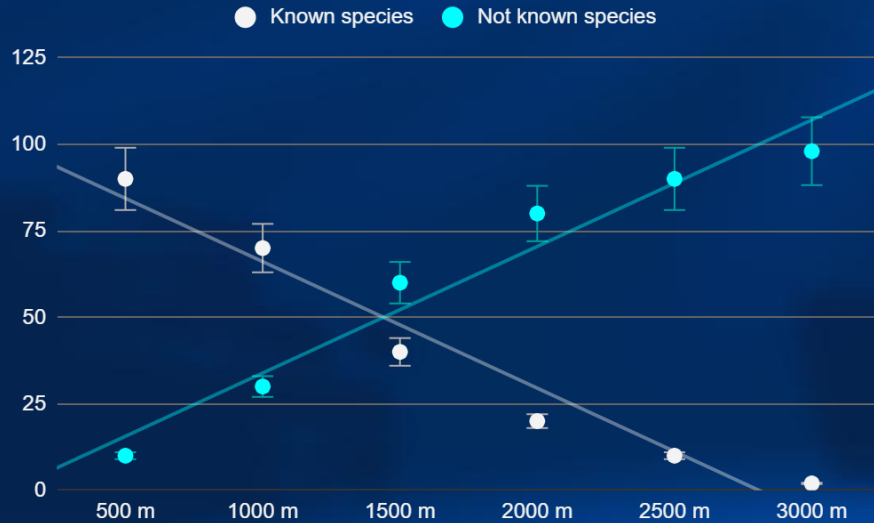
